# TECHNICAL BASES

## 1. GAME SYSTEM

The competition will be developed with the following system: 2 groups consisting of 7 teams each one will be formed in the previous phase and they will contest a league composed of 6 rounds. In each game the winning team will get 2 points, in case of a tie, 1 point, and the loss, 0 points. In case of a tie at the end of this phase between two or more teams, the tiebreak will be the sum of all real points obtained in each board.

At the end of this previous phase, the top 2 of each group will play the semifinal, crossing against the top 2 of the other group. The winners of these semifinals will contest the final. The losers of these semifinals will play the next positions.

## 2. GAME SCHEDULE

Games will start at 16.00 hours, except for the first round, to begin at 17 h. and the last round which will be held from 9: 00. The maximum to present to the starting delay time is set to 15 minutes.

## 3. TIME CONTROL

The time control will be 120 minutes per player plus 30 seconds increment per move, until the end of the game.

## 4. ADAPTED BOARDS

The game will take place in one or two boards, according to agreement of the players. If there is no agreement will be played on two chessboards. Each player can have its own board or use those of the organization.

## 5. ANNOTATION

The annotation of moves is mandatory, in system ink, braille or sound.

Adopting the rhythm game with increase, all moves must be noted in the regulatory time.

## 6. CAPTAINS

Team captain must deliver the alignment of each round before 10 o'clock. Otherwise, means that it aligns the team composed of first 4 players in order of strength.

For the last round, the alignment must be delivered before 22 h. June 20.

The order of strength will be unchanged during the competition.

## **6. CAPTAINS (cont.)**

The captain must sign the game act.

The captain can, in the presence of a referee, warn a player to offer or accept an offer of tables. If you receive an offer of tables the intervention of Captain will be limited to answer 'yes', 'no' or leave the decision in the hands of the player.

Any other communication between the captain and his players is prohibited while the game is in play.

## **7. ANALYSIS**

The analysis room, conveniently signposted, is very close to the game room, where headings may not be scanned.

## **8. APPEAL COMMITTEE**

The Appeals Committee it will be the Director of the tournament along with 3 representatives of the first 3 teams ranked in the last Olympiad (Russia, Ukraine and Spain) and as reserves, two representatives from the following classified countries (Germany and India).

The appeal against any decision taken by the main referee must submit written until two hours later than the completion of the round in which the facts have occurred.

## **9. INDIVIDUAL AWARDS**

To achieve individual awards by board will have to play at least 6 games. For the prize on the board reserve will be needed at least 5 games.

All played games will count in bottom board that has already played.

Prizes are awarded by percentage obtained.

In case of a tie to percentage, is awarded to the player who has played more games.

In case the tie persist, the prize will be awarded to the highest ranked team player.


